### ABOUT THE YACHT CLUB

The San Luis Yacht Club was originally established in 1937 with emphasis on sailing and boating activities. The local papers included many articles about the activities which were being held to stimulate interest in boating in the community. Club sailing races and other boating events were regular occurrences at the Port up through 1939 when, by then, there was enough common interest to pursue the construction of the clubhouse. The Club obtained their first lease from the County on December 2,1940.

The Club's history has associations with World War

II. Shortly after it was completed in 1941 (the first meeting was held on July 2), the Army began maneuvers on the beach and the clubhouse was even offered as a dry place to sleep on Pearl Harbor Day, December 7. The Club subsequently leased the building to the Navy until 1944 and the Coast Guard until December 1945.

In its influence on the harbor and the local area, the Club was supportive of improvements within the harbor and was active in urging the construction of the harbor breakwater.

### FROM THE COUNTY SURVEYOR OF THE COUNTY OF SAN LUIS OBISPO

The proposed Ordinance to amend Title 21 is being scheduled for introduction on the January 5, 2016 SLO County Board of Supervisors agenda. The public hearing for the Board's consideration of the ordinance amendment is tentatively scheduled for January 26. (The reference to a 30 day notice in my previous message was incorrect, I have since learned the minimum notice is 5 days for this type of action). Since my first message I have also added an additional proposed amendment, to 21.06.026, to eliminate Parcel Maps based on record or compiled data only (aka "record maps"). In other words, all parcel maps will be required to be based on a field survey. (Tract maps already are required to be based on a field survey).

The draft text of the proposed ordinance amendment is as follows:

### Section 21.06.020(a)(2) of the San Luis Obispo County Code is hereby amended to add the following:

(xiii) The basis of bearings shown on the map shall be referenced to the California Coordinate System 1983, Zone 5, (CCS83 Z5) as defined in California Public Resources Code Sections 8801-8819. Parcel maps based on record data only as provided for in Section 21.06.026 shall be exempt from this provision. Any other exemption shall be at the discretion of the County Surveyor;

(xiv) A minimum of two monumented locations on the exterior boundary of the subdivision shall be tied to CCS83 Z5 coordinates with the horizontal coordinates for each of those locations listed on the map and expressed in feet and decimal of a foot, in units of the "US Survey foot." The epoch of the coordinates shall also be shown on the map. Any exemption shall be at the discretion of the County Surveyor.

### Section 21.06.026 of the San Luis Obispo County Code is hereby amended to remove the following:

21.06.026 - Parcel maps, based on field survey or compiled from recorded or filed data Parcel maps shall be based upon a field survey made in conformity with the Land Surveyors Act; provided, however, that if all parcels resulting from the division have a gross area of forty acres or more, or each of which is a quarter- quarter section or larger, the parcel map may be compiled from recorded or filed data when sufficient information exists on filed maps to locate and retrace the exterior boundary lines of the parcel map, and if the location of at least one of these boundary lines can be established from an existing monumented line.

It is important for all to know that the January 5 meeting is only the introduction of the ordinance (i.e public notice). The January 26 meeting is the time that the Board will hear all public testimony regarding the proposed amendments and make a decision up or down, or to continue to a later date. I encourage all members to attend the January 26 meeting and address their support or opposition to the Board.





# **Evaluating NGS58 and OPUS-Projects: Finding Accurate Ellipsoidal Heights with GNSS**

by: Daniel T. Gillins, Ph.D., P.L.S. Assistant Professor, Oregon State University





**Synopsis:** With the future of NGS veering away from passive control points, surveyors must be prepared to establish vertical control networks using GPS. Daniel will guide us through examples of real life control networks and the accuracies established using Trimble Business Center and OPUS. He will also give us a background of why NGS is distancing itself from the passive control points that has been the backbone of surveying for half a century.

**Speaker Bio:** Dr. Daniel T. Gillins is an assistant professor of civil engineering (geomatics) in the School of Civil and Construction Engineering at Oregon State University. He is a licensed professional land surveyor in Utah and Oregon. Dr. Gillins teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in surveying theory, least squares adjustments, and GNSS at Oregon State University. In addition, he is the principal investigator of several research projects in earthquake hazard mapping, height modernization with GNSS, and structural inspections with Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS). These projects are funded by the USGS, NGS, Oregon Department of Transportation, and PACTRANS. Prior to his job at Oregon State University, he spent 10 years working as a surveyor for the Bureau of Land Management and the U.S. Forest Service. He is an active member in the Geomatics Division of the American Society of Civil Engineering (ASCE), currently serving as editor of the update to the ASCE Engineering Surveying Manual. Dr. Gillins is also a member of the American Association for Geodetic Surveying (AAGS), and the Professional Land Surveyors of Oregon (PLSO). Dr. Gillins has authored several peer-reviewed scholarly papers and helps review journal articles for *Surveying and Land Information Science (SaLIS)* and the *ASCE Journal of Surveying Engineering*.
