

Drew Van Duren bio

Drew Van Duren is a senior cryptographic, cybersecurity and cyber-physical systems engineer at Leidos highlighting 15 years of support to commercial, Department of Defense (DoD), Intelligence and US Department of Transportation (USDOT) customers and their efforts in securing vital systems. Originally an aeronautical engineer and private pilot, his experience evolved into cyber-physical (transportation system) risk management, secure cryptographic communications design, as well as software and network engineering, analysis and design of cryptographic network protocols. He has provided extensive unmanned aircraft (UAS) risk modeling and security mitigation expertise to the FAA's UAS integration office and in conjunction with the RTCA developed the cryptographic securityrequirements for unmanned aircraft planning to operate in the US National Airspace System (NAS).

Drew has managed as Technical Director the two largest FIPS 140-2 (cryptographic module) cryptographic testing laboratories, directed and performed extensive cryptographic security engineering and system architecture design of high assurance DoD systems and directed large public key infrastructure (PKI) and key management engineering efforts. He continues to interface with standards bodies such as the National Institutes for Standards and Technology (NIST) Cryptographic Module Validation Program (CMVP), USDOT and RTCA, and provides ongoing security standards development support and cybersecurity expertise to the US Government. In addition to his cybersecurity efforts, Drew is co-founder of the company, Responsible Robotics LLC, which is devoted to the safe and responsible use of airborne robotic systems (drones) and secure traffic management of UAS in low altitude airspace.

Drew is an avid RC and drone pilot and performs a variety of unmanned aircraft operations legally under FCC exemption.

City of San Luis Obispo Subdivision Regulations Update Project

A comprehensive update of the City of San Luis Obispo's <u>Subdivision Regulations</u> is underway. The goals of the project are to update the regulations to be consistent with current Subdivision Map Act law, and to incorporate the latest trends in ownership boundaries including airspace and three dimensional subdivisions, and other forms of subdivisions such as small lot subdivisions. The document layout will be updated and include graphics, figures, and tables to enhance the "user friendliness" of the regulations. City staff will be conducting ongoing outreach to receive feedback from interested parties, and would appreciate the opportunity to garner input prior to development of draft regulation updates.



ORDINANCE NO. 3314

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 21 OF THE SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY CODE, THE REAL PROPERTY DIVISION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 21.06, RELATIVE TO PARCEL MAPS AND TRACT MAPS CONTENT AND FORM, AND PARCEL MAPS BASED ON A FIELD SURVEY

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Luis Obispo ordains as follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> Division 8, Chapter 1 of the Real Property Division Ordinance, Title 21 of the San Luis Obispo County Code, is hereby amended to add the following:

Section 21.06.020(a)(2) of the San Luis Obispo County Code is hereby amended to add the following:

(xiii) The basis of bearings shown on the map shall be referenced to the California Coordinate System 1983, Zone 5, (CCS83 Z5) as defined in California Public Resources Code Sections 8801-8819. Parcel maps based on record data only as provided for in Section 21.06.026 shall be exempt from this provision. Any other exemption shall be at the discretion of the County Surveyor;

(xiv) A minimum of two monumented locations on the exterior boundary of the subdivision shall be tied to CCS83 Z5 coordinates with the horizontal coordinates for each of those locations listed on the map and expressed in feet and decimal of a foot, in units of the "US Survey foot." The epoch of the coordinates shall also be shown on the map. Any exemption shall be at the discretion of the County Surveyor.

Section 21.06.026 of the San Luis Obispo County Code is hereby amended to remove the following:

21.06.026 - Parcel maps, based on field survey or compiled from recorded or filed data

Parcel maps shall be based upon a field survey made in conformity with the Land Surveyors Act; provided, however, that if all parcels resulting from the division have a gross area of forty acres or more, or each of which is a quarter- quarter section or larger, the parcel map may be compiled from recorded or filed data when sufficient information exists on filed maps to locate and retrace the exterior boundary lines of the parcel map, and if the location of at least one of these boundary lines can be established from an existing monumented line.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: That the activity is covered by a General Rule Exemption (State CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it can be seen that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment; and

<u>SECTION 3</u>: If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, subsection, clause, phrase, or portion thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases or portions be declared invalid or unconstitutional; and

<u>SECTION 4</u>: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on and after 60 days from the date of passage thereof. Before the expiration of 15 days after the adoption of this ordinance, it shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, together with the names of the members of the Board of Supervisors voting for and against the ordinance.
