The 2000-2001 TRIG*STAR Contest was held county wide on April 2, 2001, at five local High Schools: Paso Robles, Templeton, San Luis Obispo, Mission Prep, and Morro Bay High Schools.

The Contest consisted of solving three math problems within an hour. The problems were prepared by the National Society of Professional Surveyors (NSPS) and are administered nationally as part of an overall program to promote surveying among high school students, as well as to recognize excellence in math skills (focusing on trigonometry, the tool of the surveyor) at the high school level.




