Old Business:

The Title 21 Committee sent a letter in March to Pat Beck of County Planning. The letter requested an official opinion with regard to 1) status of pre-1893 maps, 2) what is the effect of recording a certificate of compliance over existing legal parcels, and 3) what is status of "Official Maps" filed in accordance with Subdivision Map Act.

Mike Stoker, Supervisor for the County of Santa Barbara was introduced by John Belsher. Mike spoke briefly about similar legal lot issues in S.B. County, specifically the Morehart case, which should be decided in the next few months. He also discussed the status of business in the state and its effect on our profession.

The speaker for the meeting was Dan Kreiger, a local historian. Dan spoke about the history of the railroads in this area in the late 1800's. The San Luis Obispo Railroad Centennial celebration will be May 5-7, 1994 in San Luis Obispo.
