COMMITTEE MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of CLSA Central Coast Chapter's Monument Conservation Committee is:

- 2) To provide informational and educational materials to local public agencies, public utilities, the local construction industry, and the public regarding these benefits regarding monument identification and conservation

PURPOSES AND GOALS

- Developing and updating models for Plans, Specifications and Estimates (PS&E) to provide for inclusion of same in public and private construction plans,
- Creating and distributing information regarding monument conservation to the public and others,
- Engaging the public sector and public utilities in outreach and educational opportunities regarding monument conservation and PS&E inclusion in RFPs and RFQs.

COMMITTEE ACTIONS & PLANS

☞ There have been no meetings of the Monument Conservation Committee since the May 1, 2025, presentation "**Monument Conservation: What is it and Why is it important?**" at the Pismo Beach Ventana Grill.

☞ Currently, this Chair has been soliciting cases that may serve as test case to send to BPELSG Enforcement to unequivocally determine whether the typical language in capital improvement projects regarding Monument Preservation is actionable and/or a violation of the PLS Act §8771.

A potential case has been forwarded and this Chair is awaiting completion of the construction to determine if the agency and surveyor have complied with provisions of the PLS Act.

COMMITTEE BUDGET REPORT

It is believed the Monument Conservation Outreach Program account spent **\$2,754.86**. and has a balance of **\$ 2445.14**. This is subject to acceptance of the Treasurer's report.
