Summary

Moment of silence:

- Susan Jensen

President's Report:

- San Diego chapter and CLSA president sent a letter to the City of San Diego concerning the elimination of the County Surveyor position due to budget.
- The Board approved a motion to fund Women Surveyors Summit at the \$2k level + exhibit cost of \$750. Also, a motion passed to shift leftover funds from the Cal poly Pomona student conference travel to this event.
- Committee Chair appointment:
 - Bylaws: Mikey Muller
 - Membership: Luz Garcia.

Treasurer's Report:

- Murtha provided an update on the financial reports provided in the board meeting packet, noting strong financial position with membership dues exceeding last year's revenues at this time.

Executive Director- Will Hixson:

We have a new financial person as Trisha is retiring.

Legislative committee:

- Our Legislative Analyst staff reported on a tax that is now applied to subscriptions. I.E. if you have a Chat GTP account you may be paying a tax on it.
- **AB 1933** – our technical clean-up bill had a typo that needed fixing. As written, it would allow all CE's to practice land surveying. – Glad someone caught that one!
- **AB 2224**- electronic (digital) recording, recorder fees, public record access. A motion passed for CLSA to support this bill. Key provisions: set a fee standard, keep recording fees with the Recorder rather than the General Fund, requires County to provide access to the 'true copy' of the document (no disclaimer).
- **Ab 2435**-bill to police unlicensed surveying: heavy opposition still from contractors and unions. We are trying to enforce policing an opinion- not the use of a tool. This bill was pulled by Chen- the bill's author.



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- Monumentation requirements: discussion of a requirement to set monuments. The BPELS Board is not hot on the idea. Apparently, this item has been around for a long time.
 - Motion passed to pull this item off the CLSA Leg. Comm. Active list.

Bylaws Committee:

Remote chapter bylaws were approved. Chapter is directed to members that don't belong to a chapter and to those that are too far to attend their chapter meetings.

WFPS:

Southwest surveyor: Social media

CLSA allocated \$3,500 to be a part of the Southwest surveyor state and be included in the website. Two CLSA members will join the committee once formed.

Membership Committee:

A motion was passed for a complementary 1-year membership to new PLS/LSITs. This is part of the membership increase and retention efforts.

QBS:

Adoption of professional standards positions and representative authorization – Woolley discussed the six proposals provided in the board meeting packet regarding the surveyor workforce and professional standards.

- A motion passed for CLSA to support the QBS positions as proposed by Mr. Wooley. The only modification was the LSIT requirement. It was amended to be the Party Chief only.

We believe Mr. Wooley did his homework and made an acceptable thesis. He deserves our support.

Formation of a Survey/GIS Coalition or Joint Working Group

There is discussion of a movement to change the PS Act. Two of our Directors upon hearing of this have joined the 'GIS people' committee to try and hear their concerns and provide guidance.

The Executive Committee discussed formation of a new ad hoc committee.
